EDITORIAL by Phil Stevens



INFECTIOUS DISEASES POLICY

At the Executive Meeting on 10 August an Infectious Diseases Policy for the Association was adopted.

The Association was acutely aware of community concern regarding the dangers of transmission of infectious diseases, particularly HIV(AIDS) and Hepatitis B. The Association accordingly consulted a specialist infectious diseases physician Dr Peter Stanley who also happens to be a former amateur footballer and thus has an understanding of amateur football to develop that is both effective and practical.

The policy adopted is as follows:

Introduction:

This policy is to take immediate effect for all games administered by the VAFA.

The policy is based to a significant degree upon the Infectious Diseases Policy published by the Australian Sports Medicine Federation Ltd, 2nd edition, revised and reprinted August 1991 but adapted specifically to the perceived needs of amateur football.

The Need for a Policy:

A number of blood-borne infectious diseases can be transmitted during body contact and collision sports. The more serious include HEPATITIS and HIV(AIDS) infections. These diseases may be spread by contact between broken skin or mucous membranes, e.g. the eye and the inside of the mouth, and infected blood or saliva contaminated by blood.

It should be stressed at this point that the risk factor of transmission of such infections is very low but, having regard to the potential outcomes of such infections, the Association believes it must take all reasonable steps to minimise that risk.

N.B. There is no evidence that sweat/urine, and tears will transmit Hepatitis B or HIV.

Conduct of Matches: A. During the Game:

1. Biting: (a) Biting of ANY person is prohibited; (b) Umpires will be directed to report EVERY incident of biting; (c) Clubs are directed to report through the Investigation committee EVERY incident of biting not alreay reported; (d) Tribunals and Investigation committees will be directed as to the dangers of transmission of infection by this means in order to take this factor into consideration when fixing penalties for biting offences.

2. Spitting: (a) Spitting at umpires, players, officials or any person is prohibited; (b) Umpires will be directed to report EVERY incident of spitting; (c) Clubs are directed to report through the Investigation committee EVERY incident of spitting at a person or persons not

already reported; (d) Tribunals and Investigation committees will be directed as to the dangers of transmission of infection by this means in order to take this factor into consideration when fixing penalties for spitting offences.

3. Cuts and Abrasions: (a) All wounds resulting in blood loss shall be covered by a clean dressing; (b) Where bleeding is continuing and is not controlled by a dressing the player shall leave the field, voluntarily or by direction of a field umpire, until the bleeding is controlled and the wound properly dressed; (c) The dressing of wounds must be clean and not blood-soaked. Where dressings are blood-soaked the player shall leave the field. voluntarioly or by direction of a field umpire, until the wound is covered by a clean dressing; (d) Where clothing is contaminated by blood, eg. jumpers or shorts, it must be replaced prior to the player being allowed to resume play. The player may be directed by a field umpire to leave the field until the clothing is replaced; (e) If bleeding cannot be controlled and the wound securely covered, the player shall not be permitted to continue in the game.

B. TEAM AREAS:

 It is the club's responsibility to ensure that the dressing rooms be clean and tidy. Particular attention should be paid to hand-basins, toilets and showers. Adequate soap, paper hand-towels, brooms, refuse disposal bins and disinfectants must be available at all times.

2. All clothing, equipment and surfaces contaminated by blood must be treated as potentially infectious and treated accordingly.

3. Plastic bags ought to be available to dispose of potentially contaminated clothing and dressings.

4. At training sessions all open cuts and wounds must be treated immediately and covered with clean dressings.

5. It is preferable that there be no sharing of towels, face washers and drink containers.

6. There should be no sharing of shaving razors.

Players, Umpires and Officials Personal Protection:

1. It is the responsibility of all players, umpires and officials to maintain strict personal hygiene as this is the best method of controlling the spread of infectious diseases.

 It is strongly recommended that ALL players, umpires and officials be vaccinated against Hepatitis
 This involves a series of three injections over a period of six months.

Haileybury's victory over St Bernard's was one which showed enormous character.

Holding only an 11 pt 34 time lead the **Bloods** booted 4 goals against the wind in the final term to win by 16 pts.

The charge was led by **Dave Conneil** and **Glenn Borg** as **St Bernard's** relented under the pressure from the **Bloods**.

The on ball pair of **Vin Comito** and **Luke Gollant** kept **St Bernard's** in the game but inaccurate final term kicking saw them lose any chance of winning the game and consequently any chance of getting a berth in the 2nd semi final.

The two teams meet again today in the first semi final in what should be a torrid encounter.

Collegians held a spirited **De La Salle** at bay to run out victors by 4 pts.

The **Lions** looked in control all day but a mid quarter final term run on saw the reigning premiers come within 4 pts of the current A-section leaders.

Good 4 quarter players were hard to finds as the team battled for form in the blustery conditions.

Danny Smith was in good touch in his back pocket and at the other end Stuart Hinchen wore Pat Mannix 'like a glove'.

There was plenty of spite in this game and we all look forward to next week's 2nd semi final.

The Old Boys will be disappointed with their season and I imagine the Xaverians looking to consolidate.

1ST SEMI FINAL PREVIEW

Luke Gollant has surprised me as he surely is the best spearhead option they have. It wouldn't surprise me if we see the Gollant brothers holding down the key forward post today.

At the other end of the ground the **Bloods** have high marking **Gary Phillips** as their main target with **Simon Meehan**, **Wes Byrns**, **Andrew Walden** and **Matt De Mattia** providing the other options.

Pace seems to be the key to the Haileyburian forward set up but the **St Bernard** defence is surely not slow.

Paul and Anthony Capes are the marshalls of the St Bernard defence along with Frank Dunnell who may be a bit slow for his opponents today.

The tenacity and determination of the **St Bernard's** defenders is unquestioned and they have held some very good sides to ordinary scores this year.

In the midfield **Haileybury** will be missing **Chris McKenzie** who is arguably the best centreman in the competition.

His place will be filled by **Wayne Phillips** who performed magnificently in the pivot earlier on in the year.

On either wing **Phillips** will have the talented duo of **Peter Thiessen** and **Matt Armstrong**. This pair have been consistently damaging this year and their pace coupled with their stamina can be hard to stop.

Rob Purcell can be a destructive centreman but he lacks consistency, mind you Phillips would not want to give him too much latitude because his pinpoint disposal can create golden opportunities for players upfield.

The first semi final clash between **St Bernard's** and **Old Haileyburians** should be a beauty.

St Bernard's have defied all the odds to make the finals in their first season back in the top grade and **Haileybury** have charged home to make the A-section finals for the first time ever.

This match will be a tough encounter with both teams prepared to run straight and hard at the ball. What they may lack in skill (which is not very much!) is made up for with desperation and commitment.

We will see two playing coaches in action today – Simon Meehan and Frank Dunell.



Meehan who earlier in the year came out of retirement to help lift the Bloods from the bottom of the ladder is an inspiration on the field and with his pace and skill can tear defences apart.

Dunell simply directs traffic with his exsperience and accurate disposal.

The defences will have to be on their toes today as both teams have numerous avenues to goal.

Josh Wayter, Billy Baxter, Dave Connell and Brett Carty have formed the basis of a fine defence for Haileybury and although they may not be the fastest or prettiest in the competition, on recent form they must rank with the meanest.

The St Bernard's forwards are quick and unpredictable with Greig Wood, Nick Mitchell, Gavin Keane all capable of kicking goals.

Simon Walsh is a nippy winger that is likely to pick up Armstrong - this will be a quick battle and the duel could go either way.

On the ball we see Wayne Carey tackle the duo of Mark Orten and Ian Kidgell. Kidgell's form this year has been surprisingly ordinary - we all know what he is capable of. Orten has been in good touch and both the Haileyburians will have to be on their game to shut Carev out.

Luke Gollant and Jack Overman will share the ruck roving duties - they are persistent and skillful,

The Bloods ruck rovers of Matt De Mattia and Glen Tanner are vigorous and skilled and the ruck roving battle should be a highlight.

Roving we see Vin Comito and Matt Mulkearns take on **Čhris Kraus** and **Simon Meehan**.

Basically all these players are in form and run all day. The Haileyburian duo may be a bit quicker but the class of the St Bernard pair is undoubted.

The weather may play a major role in today's result.

St Bernard's handle the heavy or windy conditions far better than the Bloods yet dry, still conditions will see Haileybury hold the advantage.

On paper there is nothing separating these two teams

St Bernard's have had the advantage of their home ground to reach this year's finals and in recent weeks have not been playing well.

Haileybury are on a roll, know how to run at Elsternwick Park and are supremely confident.

The confidence is the element that should see the Bloods in front at the bell in what will be a dour physical struggle.

Are Haileybury the sleeping giants? Haileybury by 12 points.

 All players, umpires or officials with prior evidence of these diseases are strongly advised to obtain confidential advice and clearance from a doctor prior to participation or involvement.

4. Clubs should supply disposable gloves for use by their training staff on match days and at training sessions.

In the event that medication is administered to players by injection there must be no sharing of needles.

Umpires have been directed to enforce the policy with common sense. Clubs ought ensure that on match days there is an ample supply of clean dressings for wounds as well as a supply of spare jumpers and shorts. Failure to ensure adequate supplies may result in a player not being permitted to take any further part in a match.

I read with considerable interest your letter which was published in last week's Amateur Footballer.

I have noted your comments regarding "Area-Zone Training Groups" and it is really in relation to that aspect of your letter that I wish to write to you.

I am acutely aware that Elsternwick Park is a difficult venue for umpires from the northern suburbs to get to for training.

I am aware and have experienced at first hand the concept of two training venues, one north of the city, for umpires. I regret to say that on the occasion it was tried it did not work basically because it involved duplication of coaching resources and, more importantly, it split the umpires into two groups which certainly affected the spirit amongst the umpires as an association. As you will appreciate, we have been succeeding over the past couple of years in not only increasing our number of umpires, but also the quality generally throughout all grades. One of the major factors influencing this success has been the strength of our umpires' association through the spirit it has engendered. One of the major reasons for this strength is the fact that all umpires train together as a group at Elsternwick Park.

I therefore cannot see the Umpire Committee reverting to another training venue in the foreseeable future.


We do however cater for umpires with experience who are unable to train with us. They form the "supplementary list" and umpire in the junior sections with a young umpire.

Kirsten Tona is the sister of North Melbourne's Ben Buckley and Georgia Morey works in reception with the Sydney Swans.


Gate attendants are reporting quite frequent instances of club supporters and even players belonging to certain clubs refusing to pay at gates or simply climbing fences into games.

THOUGHTS OF A 1ST YEAR COACH

Don Leale - Reserves Coach, Thomastown F.C.

When appointed to the position of Reserves coach for the Thomastown Football Club for the '92 season, I was extremely thankful to the club for giving me the opportunity to commence my coaching career. To those who consider themselves students of our wonderful game, I consider coaching to be a natural progression from playing.

This is my experience and how I saw the year. Coaching is not without its trials and tribulations and many emotions are experienced during the course of the season.

PRESEASON

My biggest fear early was whether I could adapt to coaching a side that would contain players that have become great friends of mine over the past four years. To my relief, as the year panned out, these were the players whom I could rely on continuously for their support in what became a long and fruitless season. Preseason was approached with excitement and vigour. Not since my first season of senior football at Latrobe University under the guidance of John Simpson (current Banyule Coach) had I had to put in such a vigorous training schedule. Weekly meetings, preparation for training second accreditations course – yes it was all happening.

SEASON

3 wins, 15 losses, most by large margins. A player turnover of more than 70 people representing the club reserves during the '92 season. Quickly I learnt that success breeds familiarity. When annual subs are due we lose a dozen players. The more games we lost the quicker they dropped off. By showing discipline regarding 'no training, no playing' we lost players. Initially lendeavoured to fill the dual role of 'player coach' but quickly came to the realisation that with an inexperienced side lacking in football intelligence, I had to fulfil my coaching duties from the bench so as to instruct,



recognise problems and endeavour to solve them. Two important ingredients I learned early to being a coach are:

1. Be yourself. Everyone has their own style of coaching. It's your team and you are in charge. There are always the 'lounge chair' critics with plenty to say, but don't let this affect you adversely. Take note of these criticisms and use the valid ones to your advantage. These will hopefully improve your coaching in years to come.

2. Accept that this is amateur football and that the commitment and football intelligence of your on field personnel is not always at acceptable levels. As a coach, you always give your best for the whole season. Your level of commitment must be unquestionable, however, those whom you command will inevitably write a book of excuses during a season as to training attendances, availability on match day and poor performance etc. You must come to terms with varying commitment and intelligence levels early in the season for your sanity to prevail.

At the end of the day, as coach, blame for poor performance rests on your shoulders. I guess when I accepted the position of coach, that I would have a successful side and a premiership would be the ultimate end. If this had of been the case the I would have written about all the great and wonderful things on coaching. The scribes tell me that before you taste success, experiencing the sensation of disappointment and failure is paramount to becoming a good coach. Finding that winning formula is difficult when negative factors as previous mentioned are weighted against you, but you must remain enthusiastic always.

As advice for those considering coaching for the first time in '93, approach the position with your eyes wide open. Set goals for the season and be prepared, as it is not always smooth sailing. Use pieces of previos coaches styles to formulate your own style and try to adhere to your principles when these are tested. Eventually you will find success, I hope I do.


