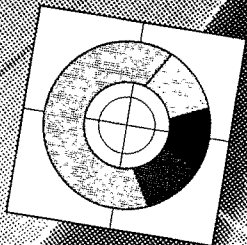

The shift in the workload now turns from organising pre-season functions and administration evenings for coaches, trainers and reserve umpires and securing sponsors for the Association to the routine matters of preparing for each week's edition of "The Amateur Footballer", preparing for investigations, dealing with the flood of complaints about runners who don't know how to behave, waterboys and trainers who don't know how the VAFA requires them to outfit themselves, through to unravelling problems relating to ground clashes due to the complexity of putting our draws together.

Clearly the workload doesn't decrease, just the nature of the work changes. Oh, and I also meant to mention that the season brings the normal listening to weather forecasts and making the decisions about when to haul the covers onto the centre wicket area at Elsternwick Park or off again so that the ground can be presented in the best possible manner for all Elsternwick Park Quit Matches of the Day.

Those covers, by the way, must be getting heavier or is it something to do with age. (Not of the covers)?

Just a few comments about a few of the items mentioned above and a few other issues worthy of note.

Wasn't it fantastic to see the display of all section's ladders and results in last Monday's Herald-Sun? Hopefully this paper will continue to realise the satisfaction it must give thousands of readers who can have access to this information on a Monday morning.

The VAFA last weekend also made its debut on Melbourne's new footy station "Magic 693". We have entered into an advertising arrangement with "Magic", that in exchange for advertising space in "The Amateur Footballer" and ground signage space at Elsternwick Park, the VAFA would be given air time during each weekend. As such Kevin Bartlett, Sam Kekovich and his panel will talk to myself each Saturday evening at 5.45 p.m. and again at 5.45 p.m. on a Sunday evening for a lengthier wrap-up of the weekend's Amateur football. Their service will also include several crosses to Elsternwick Park during a Sunday afternoon for scores from the Quit A or B Section match being played at Headquarters.

At the time of writing, "Magic" and myself are trying to devise a competition whereby a club will win "KB and Sam" for a club Sportsman's Night to raise funds for a club - details to follow soon.

To wrap up, a few comments about a few perennial problems.

Club Runners - During Round 1 four runners allegedly abused opposition players or distracted opposition players by squirting them with water as they delivered messages. Any umpire or VAFA officials who notices a runner undertaking the above type activities is to inform the runner or his club (in the case of a VAFA official) that the runner is to be replaced and cannot be used for the remainder of that game in any on field capacity.

Waterboys and Trainers - These clubs officials must be clothed appropriately (including runners). VAFA arm-bands must be worn by not only these officials but all club officials, including the club doctor who may be required to attend a player on the ground.

The appropriate clothing to be worn is clearly outlined in the Fixture Handbook.

A club secretary at the recent meeting mentioned that it appears we are conducting a blitz. Yes, that secretary is correct. We want every game of Amateur football being played, to be presented in the best possible way.

Someone remarked to me last week that even the drabest football ground can "come alive" when two well attired football teams grace it, complimented by well presented umpires and club officials.

Yes, the blitz is on. Let's all try and look as good as possible.

Let's hope that today's "Amateur Footballers" have found their way to you by the correct time and at the correct drop-off point. I apologise for the inconvenience caused by last week's "hiccups". Clubs will only be invoiced for copies received and this information had to be related to myself at last Monday's Secretaries meeting. I am assured that from this point on all deliveries will be "spot on".

Good luck to you all for your matches today, and may I take this opportunity of wishing you well for next week's Easter break. It has been difficult getting the season up and running earlier than usual, and you all deserve an extra Easter egg for your efforts.

EARLY SURPRISES IN AMATEUR OPENING

Early days, I know, but already a few surprises in Round One to whet our appetites for the long season ahead. Both clubs promoted from B Section, University Blues and Old Trinity performed extraordinarily well in their debuts; the Blues a thumping win over last years finalist, St Bernards and Trinity thrashing last years runner up Collegians.

Old Melburnians unfurled their well-earned 1994 flag and then proceeded to give De La Salle a towelling under new coach Mike McArthur-Allen. A great start for Mark Tymms, the Redlegs new coach. Geoff Reilley, Ormond's new chief drove his team over the line leaving Xavs Barry Richardson holding the tickets. Wayne Harmes must believe this Amateur scene is easy, directing Old Scotch to a 64 point win over North. A mixed day all round for the six new coaches: three wins and three losses.

REVIEW

Old Melburnians v De La Salle

In a scrappy and sometimes spiteful match, last years premiers showed early promise of again being a power with a display, at times, of classy football to defeat a battling De La Salle by 32 points. Very purposeful early, but missing opportunities up forward, De La should have led at the first change. However, Micha Berry, Simon Theodore, Michael Lovett and Richard Webb turned it around during the second and third quarters. Boom recruit and football nomad, Scott Parsons was awesome up the back half until a facial injury forced him off. Together with Stuart Griffiths and Zani Useinov the backline seemed impenetrable. De La Salle gave an honest performance and their last quarter was hopeful, but they lacked the class of their opponents. Goal sneak Tim Joss was active and Pat Mannix, terrific early. Ben Mannix took fine marks late in the match and Coach McArthur-Allen paid tribute to Andy Waters in the back pocket and acknowledged the learning curve his new team is going through.

Ormond v Old Xaverians

Nail biting stuff out at Toorak Park, but Xavs couldn't bridge the gap on their new territory. Down by four points to the young 'Monds' as Brett Connell chipped the ball around to soak up time; steady it down and maintain possession at all costs. Disappointing first up for Robert Ralph, Barry Richardson and Xavs personnel who have worked so hard to recruit the big names in Tuddenham, Brushfield and Buckley. But 2.8 by Xavs in the second quarter wouldn't have helped. Nick Sebo shut out Mike Blood and Matt McConville last years Woodrow Medal winner has started the season well. Paul Kendrick snagged four continuing on his promising form from last

year. For Xavs, David Landrigan was named best.

Old Scotch v North Old Boys

New recruit from Yarra Valley, Mathew Simpson (goals) was all the talk in the Scotch camp as new coach Wayne Harmes celebrated his debut win in Amateur football with a convincing win over North. All the old names are there; Fuller, Stokes, Laird, Stokes and Hosking, a fine start for the Cardinals. For North, a difficult initiation for new coach, Tony Cahill, as they were eight goals to one down at half time. Paul Booth and Guy Irvine were the Purple and Whites best.

University Blues v St Bernards

The old "Pav" would have been really rocking on Saturday night with the resounding 40 point win by students over last years finalist, St Bernards. Smiles all round for Grant Williams and Co as those early wins coming up a grade are so important. The victory was shared around as 11 goalkickers had a hand in the Bernards debacle. Ben Herrald, recruited from North Old Boys, was best player. It would have been a long drive to Mt Alexander Rd for the Bernards boys, but remember that thrashing by OM's last year in that first match, then the comeback. Jason Gollant dominated with five goals and Simon Walsh also chipped in for the same quota.

Collegians v Old Trinity

Trinity lead all day over the Lions and a seven goal one last quarter really finished them off. In control most positions, they gave a polished account of themselves. Disposal was spot on and their positive play was capped off around goals. Chris Pollock and Rick Schofield didn't have it all their own way as giant ruckman Andrew Ramsden was dominating in ruck contests. Backmarkers Doug Vargo, Steve Hopkins on a wing and Jerome Sutcliffe were also fine players. Robby and Colin Phillips nabbed three goals each. Jordan Grigg (3 goals) was best for Collegians in a slightly worrying start for the Lions.

PREVIEW

A testing one for **Old Trinity** early up against **Old Melburnians** on the new turf out at Bulleen where the home side will be desperate to impress and gain a foothold in the new section. OM's took the foot off the pedal in the last quarter against De La Salle, but showed enough class to win comfortably. This week **39 points**. **Ormond** would be overjoyed to grab the away result last week against Xavs and come up against revamped **Collegians** whose youngsters may need a few more weeks to gain their A Section legs. **Ormond by 10 points at home**. **North** will be desperate out at Gill Oval to take it right up to **Old Xavs**, but all those early Xavs promises will come to something as North will need more time to settle down. **Xavs by 19 points**.

Bernards, feared at home, will find **Old Scotch** a tougher side this year under Wayne Harnes and the Cardinals will take another step forward and win a close one by 11 points. **De La Salle** will be at home to **University Blues** and while the students are a different outfit this year, an honest and battling De La should just earn the points by a margin of nine.

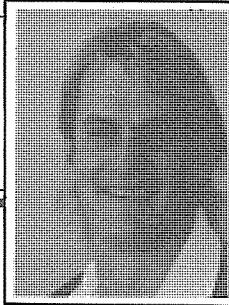

Well, we're off and running for season 1995. I'm sure some teams got exactly the start they hoped for in round one and some were more than a little disappointed.

Personally, not everything went as I would have liked. As a very nervous captain in his first outing in the post, we could not have had a worse start than a 9 goal thumping at Haileybury. As numerous people have told me since then, it is a long season, and whilst it is a great confidence booster to win the first game, losing does not condemn you for the whole year.

I know there will be four other teams just as keen as mine to open their 1995 accounts today. Firstly, let's review last week's winners and losers.

REVIEW - ROUND 1

Last year's glamour side and unlucky losers in the finals, **Mazenod**, took on **Old Brighton** at Amateur headquarters and virtually had the game in their keeping after the first stanza. They kicked six unanswered goals and looked unstoppable. Michael Pickering was dominating from half back and the forwards were converting their chances.

From this predicament Old Brighton tried to claw their way back. They kicked four goals to two in the second quarter and a further two to one in the third, before Mazenod were able to reassert their authority and hold on for a twelve point win.

For the victors, Shannon Morgan was superb in defence, the veteran Mick O'Hara controlled the ruck and other good players were Glenn Borg and John Ballenger, Old Brighton were well served by Richard Oakley, Matt Reid and Andrew Pryor on the ball, and Brad Pollock at CHB.

Banyule, as usual, upset my co-writer, by being too strong for **St Kilda/South Caulfield** (this name is definitely too long for my typing skills) at their home ground. Like the game at E.P., the Bears made the most of a strong wind to lead by over five goals at quarter time.

From then on S/SC were playing catch up footy and could not quite bridge the gap. The Banyule defence were very tight and the mid-field pressure was intense. Their extra experience at this level saw them through to a comfortable victory against spirited opposition.

As always Banyule were led from the front by John Gilham, John Turnbull and Leigh Holt and were well supported by the Grays in the back line. For the losers, Finn Buckley dominated in the ruck, Andy McGaw battled hard and Bergman booted a casual six to start the year off in style.

Therry began 1995 like a side determined to return to 'A' grade and ended it by issuing an ominous warning to all comers, as they demolished 1994 finalist **Bulleen Templestowe** by nine goals. A number of senior players have returned to the fold for Therry this year and they are expecting big things.

Mick Bosanko came out of retirement and shone at CHF, taking strong marks and booting six majors. Captain Simon Eastmure rucked well, runners Castaldi, O'Halloran and Brundell all contributed to the 56 point win.

Bulleen coach, Phil Maylin, would have been disappointed with the effort of his charges. Rumour has it training has been fairly intense out that way, and I imagine that it was another tough week on the track. Bullants had good players in Steve Young and M Cumming.

The clash between **MHSOB** and **Old Paradians** was well summed up by David last week and he was only a point out with his tip - not bad going Dutchy! The boys proved to be a bit strong and experienced for newly promoted 'C' graders. However, there were some encouraging signs for Melb High and if their conversions had been better in the third quarter, they may have made a contest of it.

As it was OP were able to steady and run out hard winners. For the vanquished, the best were Bame Sexton and Skinner across half back, Kiley and Albe around the middle and Wil Walford in attack. I'm sure Paradians had some great players but unfortunately don't know who they were!

Finally, there was the clash between former 'A' grader **Old Haileybury** and the **Old Mentonians** McKinnon Reserve. I called correctly (one of the things I did right for the day) and Mentone kicked with a handy breeze. OM's had the majority of possession but woeful kicking, both at goal and around the ground sent them down.

Haileybury, however, were able to score at will and by half time had built a useful lead. A tight, tough quarter followed, where no side could assert much influence and Haileybury were able to maintain their buffer. After swapping early goals in the last, the Bloods were able to steady and pull away ending up very comfortably winners.

Haileybury's small players were in devastating form with Nick Morey (5 goals), Chris Mackenzie and Matthew Armstrong the best of a dominant bunch. Jerome Walton on a wing and Matthew Brooks in defence completed the day for the Toners.

PREVIEW - ROUND 2

The **Old Mentonians** host **Mazenod** in what should be a fantastic contest at Keysborough. OM's are always hard to beat on their own turf and will be keen to regroup after last week's fadeout. They will be looking more bite around the packs and some better disposal around the ground. Some traditional pressure footy will also be the order of the day.

The 'Nodders have picked up some "average" recruits in the Pickerings and Simon Verbeek - not a bad week's work! They will add an extra dimension to the tough running and possession football that saw Mazenod in the verge of 'A' grade last year.

I think the 'Nodders may just be a little too fit and classy and will run out victors by 20 points.

In a battle of two losers from last week I can see **Bulleen Temp** and **Old Brighton** having a ding dong battle down at the Beach Road oval in Brighton. Because of the location and only because of this, I think **O.B.** can hang on in a tight encounter by 8 points.

St Kilda/Sth Caulfield (if you thing I'm typing that out again you're wrong) welcome near neighbours **Haileybury** for their 'C' grade flag unfurling today. If the Bloods can choke the supply to Bergman and play their own brand of running football, they should run out comfortable victors. **Haileybury** by 35 points.

Melbourne High make the long trek out to Oak Park to play **Therry** on their turf - a tough assignment at any time. This is compounded by Therry's confidence boosting win last week and Melb. High's loss. Therry will be too strong and too experienced for the new boys. **Therry** by 50+.

Old Paradians take on the unpredictable **Banyule** at Bundoora today in what could be a sizzler or a fizzer. At their best these sides are capable of tough uncompromising footy sprinkled with some wonderful skills. At their worst, you wouldn't walk to the end of the street to watch them.

I think the time of year will ensure both sides are jumping out of their skins to perform and this will be a game well worth a look. Sorry I won't be there, but I have a prior commitment. **OP's** to be just too strong in a tussle to the end, by 10 points.

My selections then are:

Old Haileybury, Old Paradians, Therry, Old Brighton, Mazenod.

David Holland has selected the same except he has backed **Bulleen Temp.** to beat **OB.** Go **Old Brighton** as there is beer riding on the tipping and I want an early break!

ROUND 1

After a dominant first quarter in which they kicked 6 goals to **Kew's** 2, **Old Ivanhoe** looked set for a gala day. 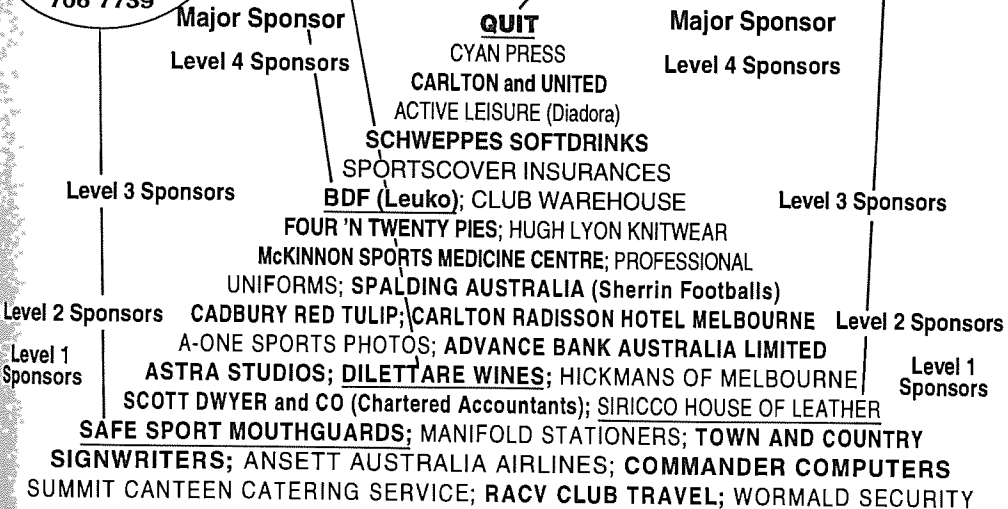
