

EDITORIAL by Phil Stevens

Football's back and in a big way

The shift in the workload now turns from organising pre-season functions and administration evenings for coaches, trainers and reserve umpires and securing sponsors for the Association to the routine matters of preparing for each week's edition of "The Amateur Footballer", preparing for investigations, dealing with the flood of complaints about runners who don't know how to behave, waterboys and trainers who don't know how the VAFA requires them to outfit themselves, through to unravelling problems relating to ground clashes due to the complexity of putting our draws together.

Clearly the workload doesn't decrease, just the nature of the work changes. Oh, and I also meant to mention that the season brings the normal listening to weather forecasts and making the decisions about when to haul the covers onto the centre wicket area at Elsternwick Park or off again so that the ground can be presented in the best possible manner for all Elsternwick Park Quit Matches of the Day.

Those covers, by the way, must be getting heavier or is it something to do with age. (Not of the covers)?

Just a few comments about a few of the items mentioned above and a few other issues worthy of note.

Wasn't it fantastic to see the display of all section's ladders and results in last Monday's Herald-Sun? Hopefully this paper will continue to realise the satisfaction it must give thousands of readers who can have access to this information on a Monday morning.

The VAFA last weekend also made its debut on Melbourne's new footy station "Magic 693". We have entered into an advertising arrangement with "Magic", that in exchange for advertising space in "The Amateur Footballer" and ground signage space at Elsternwick Park, the VAFA would be given air time during each weekend. As such Kevin Bartlett, Sam Kekovich and his panel will talk to myself each Saturday evening at 5.45 p.m. and again at 5.45 p.m. on a Sunday evening for a lengthier wrap-up of the weekend's Amateur football. Their service will also include several crosses to Elsternwick Park during a Sunday afternoon for scores from the Quit A or B Section match being played at Headquarters.

At the time of writing, "Magic" and myself are trying to devise a competition whereby a

club will win "KB and Sam" for a club Sportsman's Night to raise funds for a club – details to follow soon.

To wrap up, a few comments about a few perennial problems.

Club Runners – During Round 1 four runners allegedly abused opposition players or distracted opposition players by squirting them with water as they delivered messages. Any umpire or VAFA officials who notices a runner undertaking the above type activities is to inform the runner or his club (in the case of a VAFA official) that the runner is to be replaced and cannot be used for the remainder of that game in any on field capacity.

Waterboys and Trainers – These clubs officials must be clothed appropriately (including runners). VAFA armbands must be worn by not only these officials but all club officials, including the club doctor who may be required to attend a player on the ground.

The appropriate clothing to be worn is clearly outlined in the Fixture Handbook.

A club secretary at the recent meeting mentioned that it appears we are conducting a blitz. Yes, that secretary is correct. We want every game of Amateur football being played, to be presented in the best possible way.

Someone remarked to me last week that even the drabbest football ground can "come alive" when two well attired football teams grace it, complimented by well presented umpires and club officials.

Yes, the blitz is on. Let's all try and look as good as possible.

Let's hope that today's "Amateur Footballers" have found their way to you by the correct time and at the correct drop-off point. I apologise for the inconvenience caused by last week's "hiccups". Clubs will only be invoiced for copies received and this information had to be related to myself at last Monday's Secretaries meeting. I am assured that from this point on all deliveries will be "spot on".

Good luck to you all for your matches today, and may I take this opportunity of wishing you well for next week's Easter break. It has been difficult getting the season up and running earlier than usual, and you all deserve an extra Easter egg for your efforts.

REVIEW

Old Melburnians v De La Salle

In a scrappy and sometimes spiteful match, last years premiers showed early promise of again being a power with a display, at times, of classy football to defeat a battling De La Salle by 32 points. Very purposeful early, but missing opportunities up forward, De La should have led at the first change. However, Micha Berry, Simon Theodore, Michael Lovett and Richard Webb turned it around during the second and third quarters.  $^\prime$ ell, we're off and running for season 1995. I'm sure some teams got exactly the start they hoped for in round one and some were more than a little disappointed.

Personally, not everything went as I would have liked. As a very nervous captain in his first outing in the post, we could not have had a worse start than a 9 goal thumping at Haileybury. As numerous people have told me since then, it is a long season, and whilst it is a great confidence booster to win the first game, losing does not condemn you for the whole year.

I know there will be four other teams just as keen as mine to open their 1995 accounts today. Firstly, let's review last week's winners and losers.

REVIEW - ROUND 1

As always Banyule were led from the front by John Gilham, John Turnbull and Leigh Holt and were well supported by the Grays in the back line. For the losers, Finn Buckley dominated in the ruck, Andy McGaw battled hard and Bergman booted a casual six to start the year off in style.

ROUND 1
